

At Bright Beginnings Nursery, we are advocates of the importance of recognizing the fact that EVERY child matters.

We aim to achieve the following outcomes in the following ways:

#### **Staying safe**

- Complying with the UAE child protection legislation
- Staff training, rigorous vetting and recruitment procedures

• Children are encouraged to learn about safety through various activities, such as - car and road safety, staff role modelling activities to encourage them to protect themselves, calling for help and being self assured

- Rigorous risk assessment
- Promoting safety as part of planning
- Encouraging children to take safe risks in their play

#### **Being healthy**

- · Encouraging children to be aware of healthy practices and lifestyles
- Regular hand washing opportunities
- Role play dentist, hospital, doctors etc
- Healthy lunch boxes
- Promoting positive self image and identity
- Promoting positive self-esteem
- Healthy feelings
- Sharing stories from home
- Promoting physical development and exercise
- Gardening
- Walking
- Daily outdoor provision

#### Enjoying and achieving through learning

• Children are encouraged to attend and enjoy their nursery experience through the offering of stimulating activities and experiences in an environment which is child led.

• Children's progress is monitored across age appropriate developmental milestones, ensuring all children are progressing towards Early Learning Goals.

• Staff meet out of nursery hours to discuss all children's developing needs and interests, observations and the planning of activities.

• Children are encouraged to develop healthy independence through all activities and routines during the day.

#### Making a positive contribution to society

- Putting together an end of year performance
- Helping those children younger than themselves
- Developing caring relationships for each other
- Taking part in events celebrating cultural diversity
- Promoting the idea of global citizens
- Welcoming parents and visitors to the nursery

- Role playing with money at nursery market stalls and grocery stores
